What should my child know by the end of 3rd grade?

Listening

1. Listen attentively in group situations.
2. Understand grade level material.

Speaking

1. Speak clearly.
2. Ask and respond to questions.
3. Participate in conversations.
4. Stay on topic during conversation.
5. Take turns in conversation.
6. Maintain eye contact during conversation.
7. Summarize a story.
8. Explain what has been learned.

Reading

1. Mastered phonics.
2. Use clues from language content and structure to help understand what is read.
3. Predict and justify what will happen next in a story.
4. Ask and answer questions regarding reading material.
5. Use acquired information to learn about new topics.
6. Read grade level books.

Writing

1. Include details in writing.
2. Write stories and letters.

3. Spell simple words correctly.
4. Write clearly in cursive.
